- *Range of Dynamics*
- *Style of Jazz Solos*
- fast and scalar? Lots of patterns? Lots of space? What types of scales?
- *Phrasing and Vibrato*
- *Ensemble Sound*
- Balance, togetherness, group dynamic, breathing
